Özel Karşıyaka Yamanlar İlköğretim Okulu in Izmir, Turkey, is one out of nine schools involved in the Comenius project called "Food for Thought".

It is a big school, with lots of teachers and young pupils and lots of facilities and new technology.

Pupils are happy to study lots of interesting subjects. They can speak good English. They are very talented in Ebru - that's a traditional painting art that we learnt about when visiting their school. Some pupils were happy to show us their ability in making wonderful paintings that the school teaching staff framed and offered us as gifts.

Now these paintings are on display at Partners' Corner in our school.

What is Ebru after all ? It's one of the most unique and beautiful forms of Turkish art. Ebru, or water marbling, is formed by drawing designs with dye on top of water, and then carefully placing paper on the surface of the water in order to absorb the dye. Each dye bath can only be transferred to paper onceevery original piece of Ebru is unique.

The first step in Ebru is getting the perfect dye. Dyes are created from various organic substances. The next step is getting the perfect water bath in which to place the dye. Then the marbler gathers her homemade horsehair brushes for detail work, needles for dropping dye onto the water, and homemade combs for drawing the dye through the water. The water is placed in a tray, only slightly larger than the paper to be used. Now, the creative portion of the work begins. Using only a mental idea of the finished product, the marbler drops dye onto the water surface with the needles, spreads the dye with the handmade combs, and uses the brushes to draw a design.

Flowers, birds, geometric designs, and calligraphy are common choices for the Ebru artists.

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

Dictionary of Greetings and Weather Terms

Our first end product, the Dictionary, is to be over in May 2009. It includes greetings and weather terms in nine languages (English, Italian, Spanish, Slovenian, Polish, Danish, Welsh and Romanian), illustrations (pupils' drawings and/or digital photos) and audio files for each item.

Our project website, that is in progress now, already displays the Dictionary. Anyway, you will find the "Multilingual grid of greetings and weather" helping English: Hello ! Italian: Ciao ! Romanian: Bună ! Slovenian: Zdravo. Polish: Cześć. Danish: Hej. Turkish: Merhaba. Welsh: Helo. Spanish: Hola.


you to say "Hello", "Thank you", "Good bye", "What's the weather like today ?" and much more than that in nine languages. Go also to "Weather dictionary" or "Greetings dictionary" and click on a phrase to read the translation; click on a phrase again to listen to the native pronunciation. Have a try! It can be funny as well as useful.

Climate

Pupils have some idea about climate all over Europe but is it the real one? Besides, temperature has been changing in Europe so that it seems difficult to have a good guess.

Asking the pupils "Which do you think is the coldest country? Choose from England, Italy, Romania, Slovenia, Poland, Denmark, Turkey, Wales and Poland.", we found that Poland is the coldest (15 out of 44 answers), Denmark (9), Wales (4), Turkey (3), Slovenia (2), England (1), Italy (1), Romania (1), Spain (1) while 7 pupils didn't answer. Asking about the hottest country, the top we found is: Spain (18 out of 44), Turkey (8), Wales (4), Romania (3), Italy (2), Denmark (2), England (2), Poland (1) but 4 pupils had no idea.

Both pupils and teachers can surely know the right answers now because we have been reading the temperature at noon every day since September 2008, exchange info with partners, make graphs and display them at the project corner in each school.


This motto is so real.
